#### Actions which have been taken or will be taken following the survey

- Swimming lessons are now available after school on 2 evenings per week
- Knowledge organisers, which outline the learning for the half term, are on the class page section of the website. These were on the website page last year but parents will be emailed going forwards when these have been put on so know when to look. They are all on the class pages currently for this half term along with spellings. Teachers will also put educational visit photos on their web page.
- A new facebook school account has been set up to reach more parents as a way of celebrating rewards and sharing news. Child of the week photos and Wales Code badge rewards are now being put on here rather than twitter.
- Teachers will be holding a class assembly this year to give children the chance to showcase learning to parents/carers (to be arranged)
- Parents will be invited in to the classroom this year to see their child's learning
- The school community now has a PTFA which have organised and have plans for a series of events this year to raise money and bring the school community together. They have their own facebook webpage.
- Mrs McDonald has been appointed school's mental well-being lead after completing a training course. She has plans to form a team of staff to support with this so that children who need it can access support sessions. This could be, for example, if a child has suffered a bereavement where they would benefit from some work being done in school. More information about this to come. In school, we have 3 well-being Wednesday days planned for all children across the year. The first of which will be on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> October where the focus is on developing resilience (one of our school drivers).
- Clubs A key stage 2 football club will be starting after half term. Mrs Sampson will also be starting an after school choir club after half term (An email will be sent out about this).
   More clubs will be arranged as the year progresses.
